As the season for all age groups and teams has now drawn to close, we get a chance to look back and plan with enthusiasm for the 2018/19 season

The season started brightly under the guidance of Andy Carroll and Pete Carletti. New recruits Sean Long and Martin Gleeson were guiding the team round the park and with several wins under their belt including a massive derby win over Wigan and a cup win over Tarleton things were looking very promising. Injuries and absentees then hit the squad hard and a run of poor performances led to somewhat of a shake-up. The introduction of a new of head of coaching Paul Wingfield, some timely new recruits in Matty Johnsons and Andrew Bourne amongst others and then the return of Craig Thomas from injury, who had started the season brightly and was still the clubs leading try and points scorer after a lengthy absence reignited Orrell's season.

The club appointed new Head of Coaching Paul Wingfield in January 2018 and he made an immediate impact. He has brought a consistent and sustainable plan for both coach and player development to the Club and the closing stages of the season saw an entertaining and more free flowing style of rugby. The first team increased their points scored average massively and eventually finished in the top half of the South Lancashire / Cheshire League 2.



There were numerous stand out performances but as the season ended the local Derby v Aspull will live long in the memory. Orrell were trailing at half time and having been under constant pressure in a full blooded and feisty first 40 minutes, re-emerged from the changing rooms and ran riot in a second half team performance that demonstrated just what this talented group of young players are capable of. The game ended 33 - 35 in Orrell's favour. Craig Thomas slotted a last-minute penalty kick between the sticks, much to the delight of the players, coaches and fans of Orrell RUFC. Paul, Andy, Pete, John Dickinson, Craig Farrimond and the new second team coaches Billy Ashton and Brian Roberts are all eagerly looking forward to pre-season and both the first 1st and 2nd XV 2018/19 seasons.

This is the third year Aaron has been selected to play in the 'Euros' for the Mixed U18s, first playing in the Netherlands at the tender age of 15 and again in Dublin last year.

Niall has represented England Touch at U15s level for the past 2 years but has been selected to play for the U18s this year alongside his brother. This is only the 2nd time a 14-year-old has been selected for an England U18s squad. The first was another Wigan based touch player. This year promises to be a great tournament with this mixed U18s touch squad being the strongest out of all 3 years our boys have been involved, so let's hope they can bring back some silverware.

Head Coach Gary Povall said "I am very proud of the achievements of all the players at Orrell RUFC 'Anvils' Touch. Every player has improved so much since we started it is great to see. For us to produce 2 International players this year is a massive boost for the touch section and the club in general."

During those 3 successful seasons, Orrell's second team has gone from strength to strength under the guidance of Head Coach Glynn Worley and Assistants Pete Carletti and Andy Carroll. The 2XV team has recently secured back to back promotion in the Raging Bull Leagues.

Orrell RUFC is extremely proud and very grateful to Glynn for everything he has managed to achieve with the 2XV and his drive and determination in pushing the team forward and he will be greatly missed. However, we are pleased to say that Glynn is not retiring completely from Orrell RUFC and will continue to be a member of the JV Board and Fundraising Team.



The team itself has gone from strength to strength under Glynn's watch; regularly having over 20 lads competing for positions on a Saturday afternoon, making it hard to believe that our victorious and

amazing 2XV were only formed in December 2014 (following a conversation at an Executive meeting). From that initial meeting in 2014 and a recruitment drive, the "development team" had over 50 players who wanted to pull on the Orrell RUFC jersey and between them won 7 out of their first 8 games.

Determined that the team should grow and develop, Glyn Worley, Manager of the 2XV, entered the team into the Raging Bull League for the 2015-2016 season. They also changed their name to Orrell RUFC 2XV — much more fitting — given they had developed beyond recognition! During the 2015-2016 season, the team continued to grow its player base but due to the inclement weather that season, several games had to be cancelled or rearranged, which impacted everyone in the League.

Determination not development should have been their handle at this stage, completing all but one fixture, the team finished the League in 5th place. Ever thankful to Bucket and Sponge's Vanessa, our Team Physio, who dealt with the considerable number of injuries sustained (although not as bad as the oppositions) – even having to call out the ambulance service on 3 separate occasions. Hoping not to have to continue its relationship with the local Ambulance Service, the 2XV limped into the 2061-2017 season with a player base that had increased to 109 and an increased determination to develop the players on that list and create some team stability. Glynn's "baby" has now grown up into a championship side who secured promotion yet again this year to Division 3. Glynn has built not only a team but a culture that has people wanting to be involved.

The end of the Mini Section season was marked with the annual Presentation Evening. A great evening and special thanks to our open age squad members who presented the awards.








An invitation from Winstanley Park Cricket Club
