ORRELL RUFC VS PORT SUNLIGHT

PORT SUNLIGHT 10 | ORRELL 118

Orrell moved into the second promotion spot in Lancashire/Cheshire Division Two with a commanding performance against Port Sunlight on the Wirral. With ball in hand, they were simply too much for the overwhelmed hosts to deal with, running in eighteen tries in a display of supreme support play.

The Orrell juggernaut started after five minutes when wingers Matty Johnson and Craig Thomas linked and James Ratcliffe touched down at the corner. Jack Granby, Wilbur Harris, and Johnson also crossed inside the first fifteen minutes and when Adam Worley crossed in support of Lloyd Davies after 20 minutes, Thomas' third goal had the visitors out of sight and pocketing an attacking bonus point. It didn't stop there.

Fullback Chris Owen got on the end of a flowing move, Kieron Herbert cut a brilliant line back against the defence from another Davies pass before Ratcliffe grabbed his second. Port Sunlight had no answer to any of Orrell's play and Steve Ormesher finished the half on a high with an elusive run that saw the number eight beat several defenders to the line. The sixth goal from Thomas gave Orrell an unassailable 57-0 lead at the interval.

Port Sunlight had the first say of the second half with the impressive Dan Turner responding quickly from close range, but normal service was resumed when captain Dan Huxley stepped back following some good work from outstanding Andrew Kelly. Thomas added his seventh goal before being withdrawn and it was 64-5.

With youngsters Andrew Bourne and Alex Gaskell taking the field you would be forgiven for thinking that Orrell were going to take the second half easily. That was never the case and within moments Bourne was in at the corner thanks to good work on the inside by Kelly and Tom Halsall. Ratcliffe missed his first conversion attempt but was on target with his next seven as the visitors piled on the misery and the points. Johnson grabbed his second try before Bourne also doubled his tally. Gaskell crossed for a high-speed brace and Granby also added a second after some excellent work from man of the moment Kelly. Johnson finished off a fine team try for his hat-trick and there was one more piece of brilliance from Orrell which led to Harris steaming away for his second score, Ratcliffe completed his tally of goals to make it 118-5.

Again Port Sunlight offered spirited resistance and, after holding possession for much of the final five minutes, were eventually rewarded with a close-range score from Lewis Davies.

Orrell can look ahead with confidence to a massive game at St John Rigby this coming Saturday when they take on Eccles who sit third on the same number of points. Kick-off is at 2.30pm, everyone is welcome.

CHAIRMAN'S MESSAGE

As I mentioned in the last programme - thanks to the vagaries of the league system we find ourselves with some quite long gaps between games. I am sure you are not happy with this and neither are we. The RFU are working with the clubs on another revision of the leagues for the next season and a number of suggestions have been made. Once all this has been agreed, we will let you know the outcome.

Last year was a busy year particularly on the land project and the pace and pressure will increase even more this year. We have completed the formalisation of our JV with WPCC and now sit as the rugby section within Orrell & Winstanley Community Sports Club. This is in preparation for the commencement of the development of our new facilities in Winstanley Road which will start towards the end of this year. We continue to run our affairs and play as normal.

Can I remind you once again that we need to get our own fund raising (i.e. in addition to grants money) to £200,000 over the next 18 months? We are half way there (once pledges are received) and so have enough money to start the land development phase this coming November. However, we don't have enough money yet to complete all the work by our target date of July 2020. We will be sending donation forms again to all members that have yet to donate in the

hope that there is still more to come and we are still actively fundraising through our crowdfunding campaign, events and grants.

We have been very lucky over the last month or in raising our profile (which helps with our fundraising) with Granada TV featuring us in their evening programme, a double page spread in the Rugby Paper and, of course, being the host for BT Sport's Rugby Tonight programme. All of which has been great publicity for the club. If any of you missed any of these, let us know and we will send you copies!

WELCOME FROM PRESIDENT

A warm welcome to all our visitors and supporters this week.

With only a small number of games left to play it really emphasises the limitations of such a reduced league programme. Producing continuity and consistency in performance is now a real challenge for players and coaches. With training numbers consistently high, expectations regarding successful results and high league placings have grown considerably. Both teams are well placed and a top four finish is a very achievable goal.

The uncertainties regarding next year's league groupings are still under scrutiny involving the Northern Group, RFU and NW clubs from around level 6 downwards. After two meetings for consultation purposes, suggested structures will be put forward in February and something regarding a solution will be decided on by June. The numbers (low) in each league is a major concern along with travel distances

(particularly to Cumbria). The breakaway Lancashire Leagues (2) have taken 20 teams out of the frame and their position next year remains unclear. These two leagues are self-contained and advancement out of the higher league back into "mainstream" is not possible at the moment. One possibility is the status quo will continue for a further season before a revised programme is introduced (any bets on the situation being resolved before Brexit!)

No matter the outcome of these deliberations the players' focus is simply to finish as high as possible in their respective leagues. This will hopefully give a favourable place in any subsequent groupings.

As ever thanks for your support, please continue your support and involve others. Fund raising remains high on the agenda and every piece of support is incredibly important. Thank you. Bill
