We do however have 2 local derbies coming up against Wigan and Aspull on consecutive Saturdays at the end of the month so we will hopefully see many of you at both of those games.

As we continue our fundraising efforts it is worth reminding ourselves of the spirit and values that helped to make the club so successful for 40 years starting in the 1960's. Much of that club spirit came from the social aspects of the game. Since losing Edge Hall Road we have been limited in our ability to meet regularly and to generate that feeling of togetherness. That is why the project to build our own facilities is so important.

I will not repeat all I said in past programme but I would like to remind you that we need to raise £200,000 ourselves over the next 2 years towards the cost of phase 1 of the project in order to access grants for the remainder of the costs to level, drain and sow the pitches. The lead time for the pitches to mature means that we would like to start the first phase as soon as we can **so we need your help now.**

At the risk of sounding like a broken record we need more members or sponsors to come forward. We have a total of 98 individual donors. A list of all donors (founder members) were published in our newsletter and is reproduced in today's

programme. The list will be added to over the next year and will be carried forward into a more permanent recognition once we occupy our new ground. We are open to suggestions on what type of recognition you think would be appropriate.

I will not put any further figures here save to say that donations have slowed to a trickle In the 6 months since we sent appeal letters to all members and former members. We will be sending out further letters to members At the end of the season

If you want to ask any questions about how our plans are going then why not come to the AGM which is at 7.30pm on the 30th of May at St Luke's Parish Hall.

At last count we had some 270 adult members so there are many more that haven't donated than those that have so let's see if we can double the number of 98 donors by this summer.

Hello and welcome to our last home fixture of the season.

Didsbury are battling it out with Heaton Moor and Aspull for a third / fourth place finish and have excellent recent form having won six of their last eight games. We have one or two players back from injury / holidays last week in Tom Hallsall, Matty Stott and Gaz Nic but are without one of our big games players in Jonathon Pegg who takes a well earned break with the family.

Heaton Moor finished disappointingly for us and the coaching staff and lads have been hurting for the last two weeks. Although we were well beaten in the end, as the scoreline suggests, we'd had to reshuffle the pack and back line during the week due to absentees notably Hallsall, Stott and Gaz Nic on the morning of the game and we lost Peggy and Chris Owen just before half time due to game ending injuries.

ORRELL 1XV V HEATON MOOR SATURDAY 24TH MARCH 2018

Orrell Coach and Player makes his debut appearance for an Orrell side in the Second Half of the game against Heaton Moor.

This was Orrell's 3rd game against Heaton Moor this season. Orrell had lost the previous 2 games at home but had won their last 4 games.

In the opening minutes of the game, Orrell give away a penalty, which resulted in Heaton Moor, having a line-out, about 10m from the Orrell line. The home side won the ball and set up several pickup and drives- but good defence by Orrell stopped them scoring, Heaton Moor knock on and Orrell were able to clear their line.

After about 10 minutes play Orrell were awarded a penalty, which resulted in Orrell having a line-on inside the oppositions 20m line. They win the throw in and the forwards set up several picks up and drives. The ball is then moved out to the backs and quickly moved out to winger Craig Thomas, who raced, within inches of the touch line, to score the 1st try of the game. Kieron Herbert converted the try, to give Orrell a 7 points lead.

Midway through the half, Orrell were again awarded a penalty, and again this resulted in another line-out, inside the home teams 20m line. Orrell won the ball and set up several picks up and drives. Wing Forward Jon Pegg picked up the ball from a ruck and drove over the line to score Orrell 2nd try. The conversion was missed, but Orrell now had a 12pts to nil lead. Unfortunately, not long after Pegg had to be replaced as he had damaged his hand

Just over 5 minutes later, it was the home sides turn to win a line out, from a penalty kick, close to Orrell's 20m, line. They then set up several picks up and drives, before they moved the ball out to their backs, to score their first try of the game. The conversion was missed, leaving them 7 points behind Orrell.

With less than 5 minutes left in the Half, the referee was playing advantage to the Home side and good handling by Heaton Moor move the ball, to the right, then back across the field to touch down for their second unconverted try, reducing Orrell's lead to 2 points.

Just before Half Time, Orrell had a line out inside their own half, but knocked on. From the resulting Home side scrum, Heaton Park run the ball from the scrum, to touch down between the posts. Immediately the conversion kick went over the bar, the referee, whistled for Half Time, making the score Heaton Moor 17 Orrell 12 at the break, giving the Home side the lead for the first time in the game.

The Second half marked the debut appearance in an Orrell side of Coach and Player Paul Wingfield.

After about 5 minutes play, Orrell gave away a series penalty that resulted in Andy Stott being Yellow Carded. A few minutes later, taking advantage of their extra player, the home side got the ball out to their Right Wing, but as he was about to score in the corner, he was high tackled by Orrell. The referee awarded a Penalty Try for the high tackle for Heaton Moors 4th try and bonus point and making the score, Heaton Moor 24 Orrell 12.

5 minutes later the home side, again took advantage of their extra player, to win a scrum, and then move the ball quickly to touch down in the corner for a converted try. Heaton Moor 31 Orrell 12.

With Orrell still one player down, the home side again took advantage of their extra man to win the ball at an Orrell scrum. They then move the ball quickly out to the wing, then back again across the field to score their 6th and final try of the game. The try was converted, making it Heaton Moor 38 Orrell 12.

Just after the game restarted, with about 10 minutes left to play, and with Orrell back to full strength, a Heaton Moor player was Yellow Carded. In the final minutes of the game, after a good run by Chris Wynne, which resulted in Orrell getting a scrum 10m out, in the middle of the field. Heaton Moor were penalised at the scrum and Orrell tap the ball and move the ball out for Rob Lee to score the final try of the game. The try was converted to make the score at the end of the game. Heaton Moor 38 Orrell 19.

TOUCHING THE FUTURE IN THE BLACK AND AMBER




